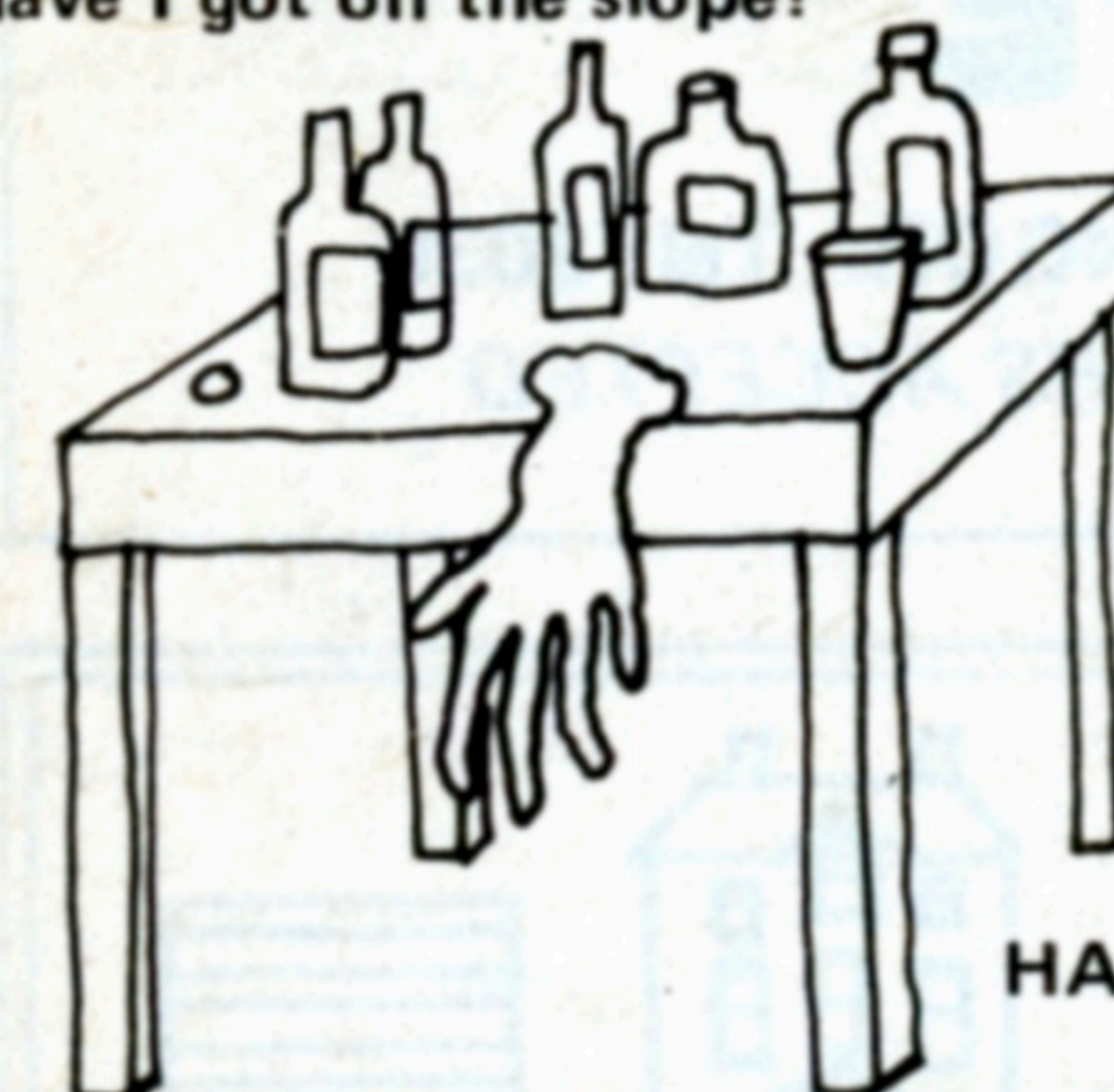
You English Pigs Make Irish Work.
